## ***Student Scholarship/Bursary (Local)***

Dear Student/Parents/Guardians:

We want to encourage your student to apply for one or more scholarships available post-graduation.

The PHSS student scholarship application deadline is March 6, 2020 at 2:00 pm (**unless an earlier date is stated**) in the PHSS office. In addition to any specific application forms required for some awards, please include in order the following documents:

1. **Cover page:** A title page for each scholarship. This page has the donor's title centred in middle, and student identification in one of the corners. Please write all documents in the same font.
2. **Letter of personal introduction:** Keep the letter focused and all on one page; this is an opportunity to place your application above the rest.
3. **Mandatory information relevant to the award:** Notice this information is in "**BOLD**" in the criteria section.
4. **Resume:** List your most recent employment/experience first; be certain your resume is error-free.
5. **High school transcript:** Ms. Cunningham or Ms. Martin will provide you with an unofficial copy.
6. **Letter of reference:** Provide teachers, employers, or other professional people with a list of your positive attributes and accomplishments so they may prepare well-written character reference letters. **Please note, some applications might request two letters of reference.** Do not wait until the last minute to request this important letter!
7. **Other relevant documents:** On a separate sheet of paper, list all your school awards and place it at the end of the scholarship application package. (**Do not copy** any awards and attach)

Please have a parent or adult proof-read all your documents for spelling, grammar, and clarity of writing.

All local applications should be submitted to the PHSS Office and will be forwarded by Ms. Martin to the PHSS scholarship committee and local award donors directly.
